d) Grace marks Rules

37	Grace marks for Regular Examination/KT/Supplementary Examination/Re-examination ESE examination		
	A	Internal grace marks	
		i	The internal grace marks shall be applicable to only theory examination/course/paper.
		ii	Only one type of grace marks shall be given either internal or external and in no circumstances a student will be considered for grace marks in both, internal and external.
		iii	There shall be maximum three marks as internal grace marks subject to resolution by the individual examiner for individual theory examination/course/paper.
		iv	The internal grace marks shall be applicable to ESE examination only and internal grace marks given are subject to passing of the said theory course/paper/examination.
		v	The internal grace marks shall not be more than three under any circumstances but as a very special case it can be more than five marks with prior approval of IEC.
		vi	If a student fails in ESE or is absent, the student will get ATKT and will be given a chance to appear the said course/paper during KT examination or supplementary examination whichever is applicable.
		vii	Internal grace marks are applicable for KT/supplementary/re-examination.
	B	External grace marks	
		i	The external grace marks shall be applicable subject to the passing of the whole examination/semester examination.
		ii	External grace marks shall not be applicable for KT examination.
		iii	Only one type of grace marks shall be given either internal or external and in no case both the grace marks shall be permitted.
		iv	The external grace marks shall be given for maximum three heads of passing.
		v	The head of passing for external grace marks can include all type of evaluation such as theory/internal as defined in the examination scheme of the syllabus.
		vi	The total external grace marks shall be whichever is minimum of - 10% of maximum total marks of the whole examination/semester examination or 1% of the maximum marks of head of passing.
		vii	For e.g. if semester total marks are 800 then maximum 8 marks internal grace marks can be given distributed in maximum three head of passing but if ESE is of 70 marks maximum 7 external grace marks can be given.
		viii	External grace marks are applicable to regular and re-examination and not applicable for KT/supplementary ESE examination.
	C	Grace Marks for getting Higher Class / Grade	
		i	A candidate/learners who passes in all the subjects / courses and heads of passing in the examination without the benefit of either gracing or condonation rules and whose total number of marks falls short for securing next Higher Grade by marks not more 1% of the aggregate marks of that examination or up to 10 marks, whichever is less, shall be given the required marks to get the next higher or grade as the case may be:- • Provided that benefits of above mentioned grace marks shall not be given, if the candidate fails to secure necessary passing marks in the aggregate course/ head of passing also, if prescribed in the examination concerned

			• Provided further that benefits of above mentioned grace marks shall be given to the candidate for such examination/s only for which provision of award of Class / Grade has been prescribed. The grade gracing should be of 1 credit cum grade point to be added to the total of C*G and then the GPA should be calculated and only for learner to move from Grade A+ to Grade O or from Grade A to Grade A+ or from Grade B+ to Grade A. Consider the following examples: $\sum C = 20$ and $\sum CG = 139$. Thus the GPA will be 6.95 which is grade B+. The learner thus becomes eligible for grade gracing. We add 1 to $\sum CG$ thus $\sum CG = 140$ and the GPA = 7.00 which is grade A.
	D		Grace Marks for getting distinction / Grade O in the subject / course only
		i	A candidate/learners who passes in all the Courses or Subjects/ Heads of passing in the examination without benefit of either gracing or condonation rules and whose total number of marks in the courses/ subject/s falls short by not more than 03 marks for getting Grade 'O'/ distinction in the courses / subject/s respected shall be given necessary grace marks up to 03 in maximum 02 subjects, courses subject to maximum 1% of the total marks of that Head of Passing whichever is more, in a given examination. • Provided that benefits of above mentioned grace marks shall not be given to the candidate only for such examination/s for which provision for distinction in a course / subject has been prescribed.
